We had been aware for the past year since Freedom Leisure took over the contract for the Pemberton that we would have to leave at some point. The Committee has spent many months looking at all the venues around Rushden and Higham and agreed on the Windmill Club, and although not ideal it was the best we could find. However, it became apparent with the car parking issues this become unsuitable.

Conversations had taken place over the last month with Freedom Leisure and the Railway Society as to how we could best manage this. The Pemberton centre has agreed that we can stay in the main hall we currently occupy until January and then move to the other Games Hall behind reception until we find another venue. The conversations we had with the Railway Club and the Good Shed that is becoming a venue that we would be welcome there once they building work was complete. They were hoping to receive a grant from East Northants to refurbish the roof and once this has been confirmed we should be able to move

in the spring/early summer of 2019. Angela asked that the members bear with us through this transition period but with a positive outcome and a home to look forward to..
